March 5, 2022, Cruise Information:

This cruise was led by Becky and Earl Skaggs to Cross Plains Texas to see the Woody's Classic cars and Baseball Museum. The weather started out overcast, however the day turned out to be great with the sun shining. We started the cruise at the Racetrack gas station on 144 leaving at 9:30am with 14 Corvettes and 1 Mercedes including guests Rusty and Glenda Stricker in their 2022 C8 hypersonic gray corvette. The directions and museum tickets were passed out. We drove about 103 miles through: Stephenville, Desdemona, Gorman, and Rising Star. We had a rest stop in Desdemona at a gas station. The countryside was primarily ranches. Roads were mainly straight and easy to drive on. We even saw a cotton field, so you know you are getting into west Texas when you start seeing cotton.

When we arrived at the museum, we had our picnic lunch at the tables provided under a large oak tree right beside the museum. The museum put out extra tables just for us given the number that I shared were coming. Some stopped at the DQ to pick up their lunch. I brought chocolate chip and peanut butter cookies for dessert.

The museum was top notch. The lady (Patti) and her husband Woody collected classic cars and baseball items over the years which were primarily bought in the 50's, 60's, and 70's. They decided to share this with others, so she created this 22,000 sq. ft. museum in 2018. Her husband passed away in 2016. There is no fee to attend, but they ask you to print a ticket

from their website to get in. The ceiling was like a blue sky with clouds. The classic cars were primarily Fords, however they had other cars as well. They had two beautiful late 50 Corvettes. I believe everyone had a favorite. Upstairs around the outer back part of the museum was a baseball collection that was primarily focused on the Texas Rangers, however there were other teams and players as well. They even had life size displays of a pitcher and batter for example. They had displays focused on Nolan Ryan, Adrian Beltre, Ranger Milestones, Ranger Pitchers, etc. There is a gift shop next door. Any purchases had the full cost donated to the charity which you choose from. All Christen books were free, and you could take as many as you wanted.

We took a slightly different route back from Cross Plains to Gorman where we picked back up on the same route to home.

The lead at the museum shared with me that next door in the building they have as many cars as were in the museum we saw. They are opening it up later this spring. Looks like a great opportunity for a cruise next year. We can go a little later and see the beautiful countryside in green.


