


Be sure to get those donations to Sandy Varner as soon as you can, so the Silent Auction and 50/50 can do their prep work sooner than the day before.

C8 Corvette Prices



In case you missed it, GM announced pricing for the 2023 Corvette Z06 last month, with the base-level 1LZ trim level starting at \$106,395 (\$113,895 for the Convertible), the mid-range 2LZ trim level starting at \$115,595 (\$122,595 for the Convertible), and the range-topping 3LZ starting at \$120,245 (\$127,245).

The 2023 Corvette Z06 is also available with the Z07 Performance Package, which adds in a host of performance goodies, including Brembo carbon ceramic brakes, FE7 suspension, Michelin Pilot Cup 2R ZP tires, and underbody strakes. Although the Z07 Performance Package is priced at \$8,995, it also requires the inclusion of either the Visible Carbon aero package, which is priced at \$10,495, or Carbon Flash Painted aero package, which is priced at at \$8,495. There's also available carbon fiber wheels, priced at \$9,995 for a Carbon Flash finish, and \$11,995 for a Visible Carbon finish.
