

The First Corvette Only Offered Two Options

While today's vehicles offer all of the bells and whistles you could possibly hope to have, this wasn't always the case. The 1953 Corvette came with only two options: add a heater for \$91, and an AM radio can be added for \$145. It used to be so simple, no?



The Corvette can Really Haul — in Reverse

The Guinness Book of World Records certainly has benchmarks for nearly everything, but what about top speed while driving in reverse? In 2014, the Corvette Stingray was clocked at a terrifying 53 mph driving in reverse, which we certainly don't suggest that you try at home.

First Corvette Price Adjusted for Inflation

The first Corvette retailed for \$3,513 in 1953. Adjusted for inflation, that's an affordable \$31,608!

Only One 1983 Corvette Is In Existence

If you visit the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky, one of your most shocking discoveries may be the 1983 Chevrolet Corvette C4, which is the only existing one in the world. The white Corvette at the museum is one of 14 C4 prototypes and 43 "pilot cars" built in 1983. The pilot cars were built to validate production and engineering processes, and as standard practice, they would be destroyed after the completion of testing, since they can't be sold. But one 1983 Corvette C4 prototype somehow escaped the destruction that befell the others. General Motors donated the only surviving

'83 Corvette C4 to the museum, which opened in 1994. So why was there no 1983 Corvette production car? A number of problems, from tooling up the plant to make the all-new car to meeting new CA emissions standards conspired to substantially delay production of the 1983 Corvette. So Chevrolet decided a later launch date (which meant skipping the 1983 model year) was the best way to go.





FOR NEARLY 20 YEARS, THE CORVETTE HAD **NO TRUNK**


From 1963 until 1982, the Chevrolet Corvette had no trunk or rear hatch. The car featured a cargo area behind the seats—which was small on the con-



vertible models—accessed from inside the vehicle only. The 1982 Corvette Collector's Edition featured a hinged glass rear window that made it easier to toss luggage into the cargo area, and this design feature remained in place for more than 15 years. In 1998, the Corvette convertible featured a separate trunk with outside access—the first trunk on a 'Vette since the 1962 models.

A SUB-3-SECOND COR-**VETTE IS NOTHING NEW**

Chevrolet claims the 2015 Corvette Z06 can hit 60 mph in 2.95 seconds, and the recently announced



2023 Corvette Z06 has an advertised zero-to-60-mph time of 2.6 seconds. But GM knew how to build a sub-3-second Corvette way back in 1969. That's when engineers showed off a prototype with a 7.4-liter, LT-2 V8 that was estimated to produce 625 horsepower. According to MotorTrend testing, that car cleared 60 mph in just 2.8 seconds.





July 12, 2023, Thurber Lunch Cruise

Gordon Museum for the History of Thurber that they had electricity issues and would be unable to manage our visit. They were very apologetic and hoped we would attend soon at their cost for the museum. So, from lunch we returned the more direct route down I-20 to FM 4 through Lipan to Granbury.
