Once again Saturday, October 9, 2021, the Brazos River Corvette Club (BRCC) will be hosting Corvettes on the Square charity car show. This is the club's 15th annual charity fundraiser. The revenue for charity donations comes from the hard work the membership donates to making the Car Show a great success. Every dollar generated by the show (through registration fees, 50/50 drawing, silent auction and donations from merchants and club members is given to charity. This year will be benefiting People Helping People of Granbury.

Beside the hard work, there are other factors that make this show so wonderful. The Granbury Courthouse Square serves as a beautiful venue. The Square offers places to eat and shop. October fest will be in full swing at the same time just a block away. The awards (donated by iWire Solutions) are high quality desirable plaques and trophies. October has been a good month for a car show as the fall season approaches. The show is well organized (thanks to Bob and Theresa Halford of the BRCC) with over 100 corvettes on display. Over 20 judges are used to make sure awards are given out fairly. BRCC member's cars are displayed but not allowed to compete.
