# Rick Hendrick Wins First Retail 2023 Corvette Z06 for \$3.6 Million at Barrett-Jackson

Chevrolet offered the first retail 2023
Corvette Z06 on Saturday evening at
Barrett-Jackson's Scottsdale auction
and it hammered sold for \$3.6 million
with the proceeds going to charity. The
winning bidder was Chevrolet dealer
and NASCAR team owner Rick Hendrick who will add the VIN 001 C8 Z06
to his impressive collection of VIN 001
Corvettes.

The Corvette Z06 on the Barrett-Jackson auction block was represented by an Accelerate Yellow Z06 Coupe, outfitted in the Z07 performance package that also featured the two-pedestal high wing and visible carbon fiber wheels. Knowing that Hendrick has a thing for Black Corvettes, we fully expect VIN 001 to be a Black Z07 Coupe, but who knows as the 70th Anniversary package opens up the new Carbon Flash Metallic Black for the first time since 2012.

Hendrick purchased the VIN 001 2020 Corvette Stingray for \$3 million at the 2020 Scottsdale auction.

The proceeds from the sale of the 2023 Corvette Z06 benefits Operation Homefront. Brigadier General John Pray Jr. USAF (Ret) was on hand and thanked Chevrolet and Barrett-Jackson on behalf of their military families.

## Corvette Convertible Accounts For Nearly Half Of Corvette Orders

The Chevy Corvette Convertible is continuing to gain in popularity, as the drop-top accounted for nearly half of C8 Corvette Stingray orders in December 2021 and in January 2022, GM Authority has learned.

Specifically, 49 percent of Corvette C8 orders were for the 2022 Chevy Corvette drop-top. That's up from 42 percent of sales in September 2021, 41 percent in April 2021 for the 2021 Chevy Corvette, and 17 percent of sales of the 2020 Chevy Corvette in June of 2020.

The Corvette's first-ever folding hardtop roof is proving quite popular with consumers, yet GM

can't build the Corvette C8 fast to enough to meet demand since its introduction. It can be argued that the hardtop configuration delivers the best of both worlds: the one-touch droptop experience of a true convertible plus the noise, vibration, and harshness (NVH) characteristics of a fixed-roof vehicle. The only downside, one could argue, is the added weight and complexity of a hardtop convertible configuration. In the case of the Corvette C8 Stingray, the Convertible weighs 101 pounds more than the Coupe. Even so, the Corvette Stingray Convertible weighs in at a very respectable 3,467 pounds.

#### **Directional Signal (100)**

Also known as a turn signal, it is a switch-controlled light that indicates when a car is about to turn.

#### Heater (101A)

An interior space/.cockpit heater. (A standard option included on all 3,640 1954 Corvettes.)

The heater was not a fresh air type heater. The heater only recirculated interior cockpit air.

#### AM Radio, signal seeking (102A)

A standard Delco, signal seeking AM radio with conventional volume and tuning dials.

The 1954 signal-seeking AM radio was the same as the unit put into the 1953 Corvette, except all but early 1954 radios had 640-kilocycle and 1240-kilocycle Conelrad national defense emergency markings. Radio antennas were standard in all 1954 Corvettes. The antenna consists of a wire mesh screen fiberglassed into the interior lining of the trunk lid. Because fiberglass is electrically inert, this solution provided a way of concealing the antenna without creating radio interference.

#### Whitewall Tires (290B)

Original tires were either U.S. Royal Air Ride, B.G. Goodrich Silvertown or Firestone Deluxe Champion.

All tires were wide-whitewall type, with whitewall widths varying from 2.5 to 3 inches.

Tires were changed late in 1954 production from tube type to tubeless, though it is believed that both types were available (and used) for a limited time period.

#### Powerglide Automatic Transmission (313M)

An "optional" two-speed automatic transmission developed by GM.

By listing the Powerglide automatic transmission as an option, it was implied that a manual transmission was included as standard equipment. This is not true.

Every 1954 Corvette had an "optional" Powerglide transmission installed (and was added to the sales price of the "base" model Corvette.)

#### Parking Brake Alarm (420A)

A warning light that illuminates/ indicates when the parking brake is applied.

#### Courtesy Lights (421A)

Interior lights mounted on the interior of the car to aid in visibility when outside lighting is unavailable.

#### Windshield Washers (422A)

A washer pump and dispensing nozzle mechanism that dispenses cleaner onto the windshield.

The windshield washer systems of the 1954 Corvette were vacuum-operated.



The color is "eluB tnanneP" spelled backwards.
