

Brownwood Cruise to Lehnis Railroad Museum & Lunch at Underwood's Cafeteria

We arrived at the Lehnis Railroad Museum about 12 noon. We first toured the museum. Most of the items in the museum came from Martin and Francis Lehnis' personal collection. He worked for the railroad for forty plus years. The museum had a lot of neat history and several mini trains set up that ran around tracks with various themes. In addition, there was two railroad cars that came from his collection that we were able to tour through. The caboose and



business pullman car were very interesting. You got a sense of life back then. The pullman car was luxury at that time. Wow, not what we would consider luxury. In addition, they moved a train depot from Kress, Texas to the museum, which was also decked out with time period items. A few of our members road the six-minute minitrain. They braved the ride out in the sun.

A little side note. Being the lead car, we observed at the museum that following a truck hauling hay is not the best thing.
