

The Corvette America was Conceived in Secret



Corvette America Historical Facts

Years Produced	1979-1980 (1980 Model Year)
Number of Confirmed Units Produced	6
Number of Units Initially Planned	40
Base Price	\$35,000

The original idea for the four-door Corvette came from General Motors themselves, although they were wary of attaching their name to the creation directly because of the unlikelihood of it being successful. So, the job went to California Custom Coach, and they were tasked with producing 40 preliminary models for civilian use. Initially, after those 40 were produced and sold, it was to be judged if the Corvette America could survive in the mass market. However, thanks to an astronomically-high \$35,000 price tag, undoubtedly among other factors, only six were produced, and the four-door Corvette was then seen as a massive failure.

Astronomic price tags are something that has stayed with the Corvette America for over 40 years now, as <u>sightings of this elusive model for sale have been reported</u>. Apparently, one example has surfaced for sale just north of \$100,000, and then reappeared around 2017 for \$119,650, before jumping back out of the woodwork a few months later at a startling \$275,000. It's not known whether or not the car changed hands, so placing an accurate value on this model today is quite tricky. Only two examples are still known to survive.



All New 4-Door 2025 Corvette SUV "Will It Fail?"

Next year, we can expect Chevrolet to release an all-new 2025 Corvette SUV.

Before those words set in, I'll save you the worry. The chances of the Corvette SUV being an electric-only vehicle are slim. GM is believed to have the Porsche Cayenne in its crosshairs with this release. Meaning the Mach-E isn't even on its radar. The Corvette has long competed with the Porsche 911, so it is fitting that GM finds another way to compete with the notorious Porsche in a different vehicle class.

Knowing that the Porsche Cayenne is the target to beat, we can manage our expectations and have a roundabout idea of the outcome. The current 2023 Cayenne can be had with a single-turbo V-6 making 335 horsepower, a twin-turbo V-6 making 434 horsepower, and a twin-turbo V-8 making 541 horsepower. With this information, the Corvette SUV is expected to offer a similar engine lineup with a similar power band. It is also confirmed that the Corvette SUV will be all-wheel drive.

This isn't anything shocking, as most SUVs are AWD. However, this gets interesting once you remember that GM has recently launched their all-new e-AWD system in the hybrid E-Ray Corvette. The e-AWD system adds 160 horsepower to the front wheels. A quote from GM reveals, "The electric motor adds 125 lb.-ft. of torque to the front wheels. The result is truly impressive acceleration, whether off the line, exiting corners, or during passing maneuvers. In addition, the system offers limited EV-only drive modes to allow you to move your car or stealthily exit your neighborhood."



The SUV will receive the classic Corvette Z code option package. If GM genuinely listens to its fanbase, we may see that 682 horsepower 6.2L V-8 from the Cadillac Escalade V.

GM will attempt to produce a high-performance SUV with an American V8 rumble. However, that does not mean that it will be loved and accepted by the Corvette purists of the world. We will find out how well the Corvette SUV is accepted when it hits the market in the last half of 2024, with a starting price somewhere in the ballpark of \$60,000.
